H. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Alvarez announced the following:

- Dr. Mark Jennings, Principal at Mt. Hebron Middle School has announced his retirement before the start of the 2010-2011 school year.
- Glenfield asbestos situation is very much under control and that the air quality tests were negative for asbestos.
- The Montclair High Schools' Baseball dinner was a great fund raiser and that the boys' fencing team won second place in the oldest fencing competition in the state.

- The Governor has recognized the month of January as School Board Recognition month.

- 1. The *Kirwan Report* was presented by Tanya Coke, Steve Menendian, Vaughn Williams, Sean Young, and Jonathan Rosenberg about the districts' magnet school system in compliance with integration laws according to the Booker legislation and New Jersey's constitution.

The Board took a 10-minute recess. The Board returned to the meeting under the superintendent's report.

- 2. The *Enrollment Report* was presented by Guy Whitlock which gave an overview of the following:
 - All figures were reported as of 10/15/09
 - Requirements for the purpose of state aid were met
 - Enrollment reports for each grade level and each school
 - Racial composition of the district for each grade level and each school
 - A detailed report can be obtained from the Central Office
- 3. The *Amistad Curriculum* was presented by Terry Trigg-Scales who informed the Board that the teachers and Department of Instruction have been very active in keeping the integrity of the Amistad Act. New Jersey State Legislature mandated that African American History be integrated in public schools as part of United States History for the entire 10 months and not isolated in February.

- 4. The *Innovation Designs for Education* curriculum was presented by Terry Trigg-Scales who gave a scope on work for instructional design consulting services related to redesigning science classrooms for the 2009-1010 school year. She stated that recently IDE Corporation unveiled a curriculum-delivery approach to science instruction that will allow all teachers to succeed in tapping into their students' natural inquisitiveness about science, bring to bare all of the resources now available through a global network of experts and knowledge banks, and take science instruction to a new level.
 - Dr. Alvarez informed the Board that he along with Mrs. Sullivan, Dr. Patterson, and Mr. Murray attended a meeting in Trenton that discussed information about the "Race to the Top" federal grant. He stated that it is a competitive grant from the federal government and the State of New Jersey is eligible to receive \$200 million dollars. Out of that amount 50% (\$100 million) will be disbursed to Title I school districts. The Montclair Board of Education can participate under the condition of signing a memorandum of agreement stating that they are willing to participate. This does not bind the district to the agreement should they decide not to participate. He thinks that at this point it would be good to at least be part of the process to think about getting money to New Jersey and into the district. "Race to the Top" is working across four different strands such as standards assessment data, data and collection and data systems to support instruction, fee preparation of principals and teachers, and turnaround schools.

I. BOARD OF EDUCATION REPORTS

Ms. Larson informed the Board that the Communications Committee is trying to put a comprehensive action plan together over the next three years. She encouraged all to go to the web-site for more information on innovative projects in the Department of Instruction. She attended the Academic Sub-Committee meeting where they spoke about professional development day in the schools in February.

Mrs. Lombard stated that she filled in for Ms. Larson at the Advocates for Positive School Climate meeting at the high school.

Mrs. Taylor attended the 4th Ward Town Council meeting where Mr. Earle shared his visions for the high school. Mr. Earle's presentation was great. It was an upbeat evening and greatly attended.

Ms. Grill stated that Channel 34 can now do wireless tapings but need access to the district's fiber network and permission to record artistic and athletic events.

Mr. Carlton stated that they are reviewing the budget and working out balancing the magnet themes. He said that there are groups within the district reviewing non-instruction areas as a priority which include stipends and athletics, programs that are not required, and restructuring programs to be able to provide higher standards for schools. He added that the

Board has been anticipating these very difficult economic times and part of their mandate to the superintendent over the summer was to present a budget with 1% tax increase plus the

cost associated with new schools and class size reduction. This is certainly brought on by the economic times but the Board has a challenge to make sure that the cuts happen equitably and keep an eye on the mandate to provide education to all children and to focus on magnet themes.
