### H. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Hoover reported that as of September 21st, enrollment in grades K-12 has narrowed down from 100 students to 59 students. He added that this number will continue to decrease and an update will be provided at future meetings.

Dr. Hoover indicated that there have been positive comments made regarding school openings at the start of the new school year.

Dr. Hoover announced Spirit Day at Montclair High School and encouraged all staff to participate.

Dr. Hoover announced that he will be meeting with members of the PTA and Staff regarding the reimaging of Mt. Hebron School.

### 1. QSAC Certification

Dr. Hoover reported that the Department of Education acknowledged the District's Quality Single Accountability Continuum (QSAC) results and labeled Montclair as a high performing district. This leaves the district in an approved standing with another QSAC visit in 3 years.

Dr. Hoover congratulated the various teams on the start of an outstanding athletic season and encouraged all to support the Mounties.

Mrs. Kulwin thanked American Royal Hardware for their support in Montclair High Schools' Commencement ceremony.

Lois Whipple and Will Adkins presented information to the Board about the Montclair Fund for Educational Excellence.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Montclair School District will contract with the Love of Learning. Funding Source – Special Education IDEA Budget – Early Intervening Services.

## Resolution re: Contract with Empowering Academics
